

Piloting

Across all countries, pilots involved adult educators working directly with migrant and refugee women in formal, non-formal, and informal education settings. Profiles included language teachers, trainers, mentors, social workers, community educators, and integration specialists.

The following section presents an overview of the number of participants involved in each piloting activity:

- The Netherlands (EU Nation) – 5
- Spain (Open Europe) – 5
- Bulgaria (Bulgaria) – 5
- Poland (IRIS) – 5
- Ireland & Northern Ireland (Gifted Ireland) – 5
- Türkiye (ASTED) – 15

Across all partner reports, overall satisfaction with the Just Her course was consistently **very high**.

Key findings include:

The vast majority of participants rated the modules **4 or 5 out of 5** across all evaluation criteria;

Course content was considered **highly relevant** to the realities of working with migrant and refugee women;

Educators confirmed that the course met its stated objectives and filled a clear gap in existing training offers.

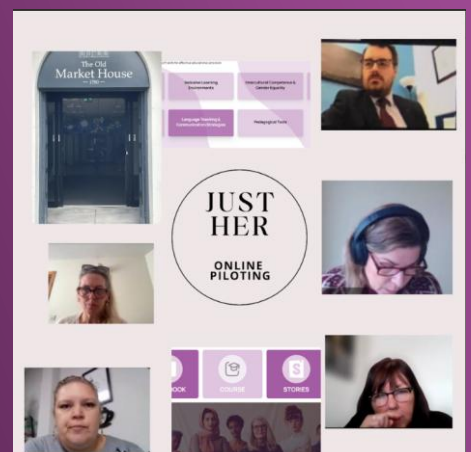
Several partners reported satisfaction levels above **90%** for clarity, relevance, methodology, and implementation, with some reporting **100% satisfaction** for course delivery.

Delivery

Delivery was a mix of face to face, online and hybrid, allowing all partners to work with their target group in a way that benefited them.

This gave a stronger engagement level, flexibility allowing for the course to be piloted fully, and the option to learn other skills, be it conversation, online tools or co operation across different situations.

A varied delivery also allows for varied evaluations, which helps us get the knowledge of the course across different delivery methods.
