Let Her In and Open Europe

The Spanish multiplier event “Storytelling for Inclusion” took place at Espai Boule, Spain, organised by Let Her In International and Open Europe. The President of Open Europe presided. Over 30 attendees included pilot participants and adult educators (language teaching, adult education) from Spain, Italy, and Romania. Speakers highlighted that education breaks social exclusion cycles for migrant/refugee women, equality is a core EU value, and storytelling helps overcome gender inequality’s historical roots. They stressed that language barriers require targeted teaching methods

Turkey held their event on the 10th April with over 40 Participants. The event was an interactive as almost all the relevant target Groups representative of NGOs, adults, educators, decision makers at local level, representatives of interested organisations, board members and representatives of several organisations, principals, administrators and teachers of some schools in Adıyaman, some parents and people from other relevant institutions and organizations participated in event.

Story telling was enjoyed by all, and the guest speaker showed the online course to all guests and other educators to ensure sustainability.

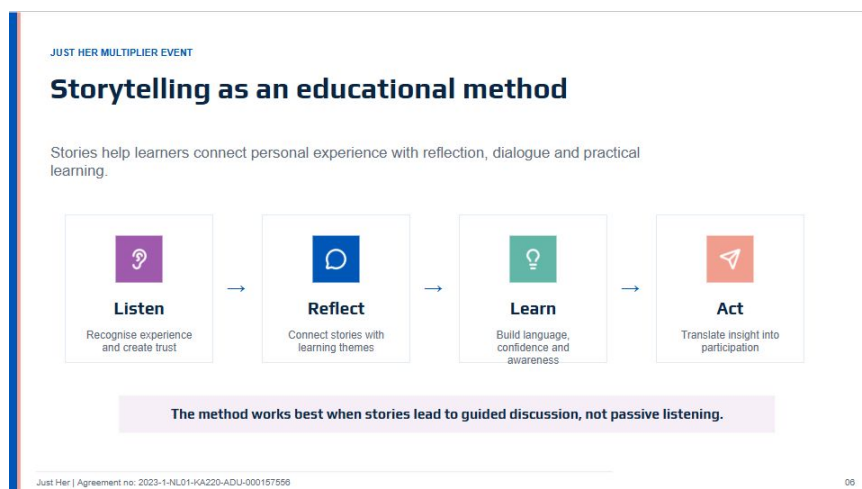


IRIS

In June Iris hosted 20 Participants in Elementary international school of Gdansk, Poland.

The event gathered adult educators, trainers, social workers and professionals working with women and people with a migrant background. A practical workshop entitled “CLOUT – Confidence, Leadership, Opportunities, Understanding and Transformation” was conducted, focusing on empowering women with a migrant background, promoting social inclusion, self-confidence, leadership skills and active participation in local communities. Participants discussed challenges faced by migrant women and exchanged good practices from their own professional experience. Evaluation feedback was highly positive. Participants appreciated the practical nature of the workshop, the relevance of the project outputs and the opportunity to exchange experiences with professionals working in similar fields. Many participants expressed interest in using the project resources in their future educational and social inclusion activities.

EU Nation



EU Nation hosted their Multiplier in Rijswijk for 20 people in June. They had practical workshops focused on how the resources can be used by adult educators when working with migrant and refugee women. Participants explored how storytelling, inclusive education, gender equality and intercultural dialogue can support motivation, participation, empowerment and a stronger sense of belonging. The event also included a moderated discussion on future use of the materials and possible cooperation between organisations. Participants exchanged experiences from their own work and identified ways to promote the project outcomes through their local networks and professional practice.

The event created new connections between adult education providers, NGOs, community representatives and other relevant stakeholders. Awareness was raised about the role of adult education in integration, empowerment and social inclusion.

The discussion showed that participants valued the combination of personal stories, educational methods and concrete lesson materials. Several attendees expressed interest in further disseminating the outcomes and in applying them in training, guidance, community activities and cooperation with local partners



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
